

## FROM THE BRIDGE

CHUCK BUSCH, COMMODORE



This article is planned to address subjects that are occurring in June and July. The most important item for the wellness of our club occurs each year in these months as we begin the selection of our leaders for the next year. It has been increasingly difficult over the past three years that I have been on the Bridge to find volunteers willing to raise their hands to fill open positions on the Board of Directors and to begin the four-year progression on the Bridge to Commodore. We have a membership that is filled with extremely accomplished people that have been very successful in their professional lives prior to joining IYC. There may be many reasons why volunteering to help lead our Club might not be appropriate for many of these, but with a pool of 900 people, we should be able to fill four-five open slots each year. The most stated reluctance seems to be the time commitment at this point in life when we are in, or moving into, retirement. I think this is a reasonable consideration. To help overcome this concern and to relieve the time commitment for both Directors and Bridge Officers, our Board is reviewing the number of committees currently in place, the need to have monthly meetings in certain committees, and ways to lessen the load on Directors and Bridge members by finding alternate committee chairs when possible.

With that said, we are currently forming the yearly Nominating Committee to generate a slate of Officers and Directors for next year's leadership positions. The Nominating Committee will be formed within the next month from those who have submitted their names for this important function. The Nominating Committee will begin vetting applicants for the various open slots in the Officer and Director positions shortly after it is formed by the Board of Directors. You can review the duties of these positions in the IYC Bylaws contained in your Club Yearbook, read the Leadership Development overview on-line at the IYC Member Central/Clubs and Committees webpage, or contact any Officer of IYC.

In addition to the usual open positions of three Directors, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, Fleet Captain, Finance Officer, and a Board Secretary, we will also need to nominate a Commodore to serve for the next Watch. Normally, the Commodore position is filled by an automatic ascension from Vice Commodore following a three-year progression from Fleet Captain. This year we have extraordinary circumstances that require a selection by the Nominating Committee, followed by member confirmation, to fill the incoming Commodore position. Further communications will be forthcoming detailing the positions that the nominating committee will need to populate.





#### **BRIDGE BUILDING REPLACEMENT**

Each month I will update members on what steps the Planning Committee has taken and projects currently being discussed.

The recently established Building Committee has heard back from all six of the "site" engineering companies who received the Request for Proposal. Two companies are interested in the project. A proposal has been received from one company and, as of this writing, the other is meeting with members from the Building Committee to discuss the details. Once the proposals have been received the committee will make their decision and submit their selection to the BOD for their approval. The goal is to have a complete survey by November 1.

In anticipation of receiving the site survey the Planning Committee will continue to update the IYC website with current information and a means for members to ask questions and leave feedback. This is located under "Member Central", Strategic Plan, Vision. Mission and Goal.

As per the Bylaws the duties of the Planning Committee are: To create and consider a five-year plan which shall be in the best interest of the Club and recommend such a plan to the Board of Directors. Over the next couple of months, the Committee will focus on our Club's Capital Projects to ensure we achieve the goal of a quality facility.

#### COMPASS FUND PC JIM NUZZO, COORDINATOR



Good news this last month on two active Compass Fund Projects. Engineering for the "Small Boat Hoist" project was contracted and terms were agreed upon for the construction of permanent shading for the fuel dock. Both projects will have engineering plans submitted to the City for approval. Based on the installer's quoted cost for the fuel dock shades, pending any City required changes, this project is funded. A similar path will be followed for engineering on the "Small Boat Hoist" project. At present the SBH project has \$100,550 committed. As previously mentioned, after the initial engineering and City response we will have an exact number and will be able to determine if this project is funded or needs more support. I certainly will keep membership updated in the August LOG.




